



Spa Resort Casino to receive new entry

New steps, ramps complement updated landscaping

PALM SPRINGS — Starting this week, as an ongoing effort to enhance the guest experience, crews are beginning to make façade improvements to the southwest corner of the Spa Resort Casino in downtown Palm Springs.

“We are creating a new entry way that will be more inviting and accessible for our guests,” said C.J. Graham, Chief Operating Officer of the Spa Resort Casino and the Agua Caliente Casino Resort Spa. “By beautifying this corner of the Spa Resort Casino, we have kept our most valued guests in mind. New steps and ramps will complement updated landscaping, which will all lead to a set of new doors for our establishment. We will also install new messaging signage.”

In addition, paving will begin to create a new surface parking lot located across the street southwest of the Spa Resort Casino. The Spa Resort Casino will remain open and accessible during the façade improvements, which will last six to eight weeks.

These planned improvements complement other recent projects at the Spa Resort Casino including a re-launch of the Sundance sports bar with autographed memorabilia, local craft beers on tap and featuring the NFL Sunday Ticket. Under the guidance of Stacy Duke, director of food and beverage, The Steakhouse was recently refurbished and now features a new rotating menu highlighting seasonal selections presented by Executive Chef Kieran Fleming. Most recently, the casino’s high limit room was renovated with new slots and furnishings. “These improvements show our commitment to a bright future for the Spa Resort Casino” Graham said.

Meanwhile, the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians continues to work on a vision and master plan for vacant land in the heart of downtown adjacent to the Spa Resort Casino.
